DIET is a nodal institute at the district level of planning, implementing, monitoring pedagogical activities in the schools of a district. The DIET is to design training programmes for elementary school teachers of the district after ascertaining the needs of the teachers of the district. It conducts training programmes for elementary school teachers, BRCCs, CRCCs and BEOs of the district. It also provide scope for doing action research. It provides resource support to the teachers at field level(schools). It reviews block and cluster level performances of teachers and resource conditions. It moniters pedagogical activities in the district and plans for qualitative interventions accordingly.

Review of Related literature

Arora et al. (2001) conducted a comprehensive study on the operational status of District Institutes of Education and Training (DIETs), revealing inconsistencies in adherence to scheme guidelines across states. They highlighted critical issues requiring attention, particularly the involvement of local communities and the effective utilization of local resources. According to the Azim Premji Foundation Report (2010), which assessed DIETs nationwide, many institutes have struggled to fulfill their intended roles due to challenges such as inadequate infrastructure and shortages of qualified faculty. Raju (2011) investigated the impact of DIET training programs on the emotional intelligence of teacher trainees, noting significant improvements among both male and female participants. Presidha (2011) examined the functioning of DIETs in Garo Hills, Meghalaya, identifying prevalent issues such as staff vacancies and inadequate training facilities. Longchar Imkongselna (2017) evaluated the effectiveness of DIETs in Nagaland, finding that teacher trainees were actively engaged in various institutional activities.

Based on a comprehensive review of literature underscoring the necessity and impact of DIETs, this study examines how DIET operations influence the development of teachers' competencies in Odisha. The research aims to explore DIETs' roles in enhancing the quality of elementary education at the district level and to identify strengths and weaknesses in selected districts of Odisha.

Using a descriptive survey method, the study encompassed four DIETs from specific districts in Odisha, involving 200 student teachers, 20 teacher educators, 160 elementary school


teachers, and 40 community members. Analysis of the data revealed that DIETs significantly contribute to capacity-building among elementary teachers and the development of locally tailored educational materials. However, the study also highlighted challenges such as staffing shortages, inadequate infrastructure, insufficient training accommodations, and limited space for recreational activities. Notably, DIETs in tribal districts exhibited more pronounced deficiencies compared to those in non-tribal districts.
